ESSENTIAL FIRST STEPS: THE ROLE OF PRELIMINARY SEARCH FORMS AND **HLA REPORTS IN UNRELATED DONOR SEARCHES**

For patients requiring an allogeneic hematopoietic stem cell transplant (HSCT), timely identification of a suitable donor is often a race against time. In cases where a matched sibling donor is unavailable, unrelated donor registries like DATRI become a vital resource. However, to activate a search in DATRI and initiate the process of donor identification, two crucial elements are indispensable: Preliminary Search Reguest Form and a High-Resolution **HLA Typing Report.**

These documents form the basis upon which donor search strategies are built, influencing not only the speed but also the effectiveness of finding an optimal donor.

Why the Preliminary Search Request Form Is important?

The Preliminary Search Request Form (PSRF), also referred to as the donor search initiation form, is a structured document designed to capture key clinical and transplant-specific data. Its primary functions include:

· Information on diagnosis, disease stage, previous treatments, and planned conditioning regimen helps donor registries understand the urgency and clinical needs, guiding them in prioritizing cases.

Clarifying **Clinical Context**



 Registries always require formal authorization to initiate a search. The PSRF typically contains signatures from authorized transplant physicians/ hospitals, serving a legal go-ahead.

Authorization and Consent



 It outlines the type of transplant (e.g., peripheral blood, bone marrow), donor preference (male/female, CMV status, age considerations), and urgency of search.

Without a completed PSRF, registry cannot begin a formal donor search, which might lead to critical delays in patient care.

The Importance of High-Resolution HLA Typing Reports

Equally vital is the availability of a High-Resolution HLA Report, typically covering at least the following loci: HLA-A, -B, -C, -DRB1, and -DQB1. This report ensures:



Precision Matching

 High-resolution typing increases the likelihood of identifying a donor with the most compatible HLA match.

Efficient Registry Querying

•We use sophisticated algorithms to search in our database. All our donors are high-resolution typed. High-resolution typing ensures that the patient's data can be accurately matched against potential donor profiles, eliminating ambiguous or partial matches that could waste precious time.

Avoiding Rework

 Low-resolution or incomplete HLA data often leads to multiple backand-forth communications with the transplant center, delaying the identification of matched donors and sometimes requiring repeat sampling or re-typing of patients.

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Conclusion

The journey to transplant begins not in the with the infusion of the cells, but with meticulous paperwork and precision diagnostics. A completed Preliminary Search Request Form and a comprehensive high-resolution HLA report are not just formalities - they are foundational tools that determine quickly and effectively life-saving unrelated donor can be found. As hematologists and transplant specialists, ensuring these elements are prepared and submitted early can make a profound difference in patient outcomes. Timely action, supported by accurate data, is often the difference between cure and complication.

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ONE ACT OF KINDNESS, ONE LIFE SAVED: OUR COMMITMENT TO GIVING

In 2024, a 7-year-old girl diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome was referred to DATRI by her transplant center, urgently needing a blood stem cell transplant. Our search team quickly identified a 29-year-old male donor, Lokeshkumar from Chennai as a suitable match from our registry of over 6 lakh donors.

Following thorough counseling by our team member, Shidin, the donor willingly agreed to donate his peripheral blood stem cells (PBSC). Initial tests were completed, but a routine scan revealed an enlarged spleen, requiring further evaluations. Just as the follow-ups were planned, the donor contracted mumps, which led to a temporary deferral.

Despite the setbacks, the donor remained fully committed. Over the next few weeks, he underwent multiple scans and

assessments to ensure he was fit to donate. Throughout the process, our Medical Director was actively involved in evaluating the reports and providing guidance to ensure the donor's safety. Adjustments in procedures, including GCSF dosage, were made based on medical advice and findings during physical examinations.

While preparations were underway, there was a delay in proceeding with the transplant due to some critical requirements from the patient's side. Despite the uncertainty, DATRI ensured that all necessary testing and clearances remained up to date to avoid further delays.

Finally, after months of dedication, the PBSC collection was successfully completed. The donor's commitment and cooperation across this three-month journey made it possible to deliver our first-ever stem cell product to this transplant center - a milestone moment for all of us.

A special note of appreciation goes to Shidin, whose persistent coordination and compassionate engagement with the donor played a pivotal role in making this collection possible.

This is a story of perseverance, trust, and the power of a single act of kindness.

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A STORY OF STEADFAST COMMITMENT: MAHESH RAJ R'S LIFE-SAVING GIFT

When a 9-year-old girl battling Thalassemia was in urgent need of a stem cell transplant, her family's hopes rested on just two matched unrelated donors listed in DATRI's registry. The patient's family was desperate to move forward with the transplant. Hence DATRI reached out to the donor multiple times, but every time in vain due to various reasons.

With no alternatives left, the transplant center reached out once more in January 2025, requesting DATRI to re-initiate counselling for both donors. This time, one of the donors Mr. Mahesh responded very swiftly and positively on the very same day and readily agreed to move forward.

Soon after, Mahesh underwent a full health checkup. The initial reports revealed a few medical concerns: elevated creatinine levels, low Vitamin B12, and early signs of kidney and liver changes. Based on medical advice, he was asked to undergo multiple follow-ups, including nephrology and gastroenterology evaluations, a colonoscopy, endoscopy, and Fibroscan. It was a demanding process that stretched across nearly two months.

Through it all, Mahesh remained calm, cooperative, and deeply committed. He completed every test - never once expressing hesitation - guided by a simple yet powerful intention: "If this helps save her, I'm ready."

Clearances were finally received in early April, and the collection was promptly scheduled. The transplant followed immediately after, and the young patient was discharged a couple of weeks later - a hopeful sign of recovery.

This inspiring journey wouldn't have been possible without Mahesh's resilience and big-heartedness. Over nearly three months, he stood by, never wavering in his support or spirit.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Mahesh—for his selfless decision, his patience, and his determination. Because of him, a child gets a second chance at life.

DATRI JOINS HANDS WITH VHS TO SUPPORT THALASSEMIA WARRIORS

On May 8th, in observance of World Thalassemia Day, a Thal drive was conducted at VHS Hospital, Chennai, together with DATRI Blood Stem Cell Donors Registry as part of its ongoing Thalassemia Free India campaign. The drive focused on helping thalassemia patients find matching blood stem cell donors and spreading awareness about the importance of donor registration within the community.



As part of the initiative, 17 thalassemia patients registered with DATRI, along with 32 family members - siblings and parents - who stepped forward to support their loved ones' search for a potential match. These family registrations play a crucial role in increasing the chances of finding a compatible donor, especially within the same genetic pool.





In addition, a public awareness campaign was conducted at the venue, encouraging community participation. The effort led to the registration of 77 new voluntary stem cell donors, expanding the donor registry and offering renewed hope to patients across the country.

To amplify the message, the day also featured a live radio show on All India Radio Chennai, where renowned pediatric hematologist **Dr. Revathi Raj** shared valuable insights about thalassemia and the importance of stem cell donation. The session included live Q&A, addressing queries from listeners and creating greater awareness among the public.



The event marked a powerful combination of education, empathy, and action—paving the way for more lives to be saved through timely transplants.
